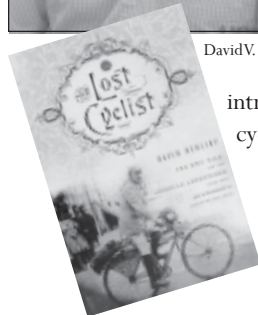
Pierre Lallement



**D**avid V. Herlihy is the author of "The Lost Cyclist" (Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2010) and "Bicycle: The History" (Yale University Press), winner of the 2004 Award for Excellence in the History of Science. A recognized authority in his field, he is responsible for the naming of a bicycle path in Boston after Pierre Lallement, the original bicycle patentee, and for the installation of a plaque by the New Haven green where the Frenchman introduced Americans to the art of cycling in 1866.
